


## Cases Adjudicated, 2023-2024 Academic Year 67 completed hearings

Of these, 10 were repeat violations 47 were sanction hearings 20 were full hearings



The Honor Council adjudicated 67 cases duthre 2023-2024 academic year, including the summer of 2024. While the overall number of cases are presents almost 20% increase over academic year 2022-2023, the total is closely sintialine 66 cases adjudted the year prior. The Council had been bracing itself for a mogenisticant increase in the number of cases due to greater availability of AI and AI tools such eshatGPT and CoPilot. Even tools that had not been associated with AI in the past, such Grammarly, have nointegrated artificial intelligence in the assistance they provide.

The Council has begun to recorde thumber of cases that involve egled use of AI. Last year, 27% of the adjudicated cases had to with AI use. This yeath at proportion has risen to 52% of the cases.



The chart above is based on the 64 honor counceisdata resulted in finding of "responsible" in the 2023-2024 academic year. First-year studeomtinue to represent the highest proportion of cases at 45.3%. This yearowever, the number of cases are ring juniors and seniors was more than halved, from 16% and 5% last year for juniors are privately, respectively, to only 7.8% for each class this year. The number asses involving sophomess, however, doubled to 39%.

It is difficult to make generaliations based on such a small sanspize. For example, of the 25 sophomore cases that were adjuted aten were from one course.

The cases that involved AI this past academiar yaere all classified as cheating (involving the unauthorized use of assistance in the completion of sign of materials "written" by the AI tool as one's own).


The Honor Council has integrated more discussifies the use of AI and the prevention of cheating in its presentations to first-year Messilasses and in the Acendic Integrity Tutorial, which is required of all icoming undergraduate students.

Types of Violations Adjudicated

On the other hand, it is also posse it hat faculty reporting is decearsing. Accusations related to improper use of AI, for example, are often moore nplex and less straightforward to identify than some other instances of plagiarism, sauce boyying a paragraphone a published source.
